

In 1967 the frequency of publications reaches more than six items per day. In 1973 the frequency reaches more than seventeen items per day. The originals of the publications are on file in the archives of Buckminster Fuller in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. From 1973-75 there has been an average of two radio and two television broadcasts in conjunction with each public lecture. There is also commercial distribution of audio tapes, records, film strips and film and video documentaries. The averages are based on conservative "Madison Avenue formulae."

- 1954 U.S. Air Force Distant Early Warning System (D.E.W. Line) polyester fiberglass domes located in the Arctic: Scandinavia, Shetland Islands, Iceland, Greenland, Trans-Canada, Alaska and the Aleutian Islands.
- 1958 Union Tank Car Company 384-foot diameter quarter sphere in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Union Tank Car Company 354-foot diameter quarter sphere in Wood River, Illinois.
- 1959 U.S. Pavilion, Sokolniki Park, Moscow, U.S.S.R. 200 feet in diameter and made of aluminum, this dome was purchased by Russia from the U.S. to be used as a permanent exhibit building.
- 1959 Palais de Sports, Paris, France; this is a 200-foot diameter aluminum permanent structure.
- 1960 "Climatron" Botanical Garden in St. Louis, Missouri, 175 feet in diameter.
- 1963 Cinerama Theater, Hollywood, California. Made of geohexes of reinforced concrete, this is a 165-foot diameter hemisphere.
- 1964 Yomiuri "Star" Golf Club Field House, Tokyo, Japan. This is a 170-foot diameter hemisphere tensegrity dome.
- 1966 County administration headquarters of Placer County, California; cluster of five Temcor 100-foot diameter aluminum domes.
- 1967 U.S. Pavilion at the Canadian Universal and International Exhibition, Expo '67 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. This is a geodesic skybreak bubble of steel and plexiglass 250 feet in spherical diameter and 187 feet high. After the Exhibition, the dome was purchased by Montreal.
- 1969 Airplane Museum, Skipoel Airport, Amsterdam, Holland; containing comprehensive display of full historical range of the world's aircraft.
- 1972 U.S. Research Station Dome—"Project Deep Freeze"—situated exactly on South Pole of Earth. This Temcor dome covers a complex of buildings as a basic environmental control and is capable of sustaining complete burial by snow—300 pounds per square foot (comparable Canadian snowload of 60 pounds per square foot).
- 1973 Weather Radome (housing weather and radar equipment) atop highest rim of Mt. Fuji, Japan.
- 1979 Ban Chiang, Thailand; geodesic dome complex used to protect archaeological site where world's most ancient bronze was developed.
- 1981 Los Angeles, California; 55-foot Fly's Eye Dome used as Information Center for Los Angeles Bicentennial Celebration.
- 1982 Long Beach, California; 415-foot diameter aluminum modified geodesic used as housing for Howard Hughes' Spruce Goose airplane.
- 1982 Walt Disney's EPCOT Center, Walt Disney World, Orlando, Florida; 165-foot diameter steel and aluminum geodesic sphere, "Spaceship Earth" theme structure.
- 1982 "Home of the Future," Knoxville World's Fair, Knoxville, Tennessee; 45-foot diameter Cathedralite Dome.

(As of 1983, there are more than 300,000 geodesic domes on Earth.)




